- 1 The *bikurim* (first fruits) were brought by farmers in ancient Israel to be placed near the altar in the Holy Temple in Jerusalem on Shavuot. Bereishit 31:51.
- 2 On Shavuot, the first offering from the new wheat crop, the “*Shtei HaLechem*” (the two loaves), was brought in the Temple.
- 3 *Katzir* is Hebrew for “cut grain” and “harvest.”
- 4 On the night of Shavuot (the first night of Shavuot in the Diaspora), it is traditional for Jews to stay up and learn Torah – a centuries-old custom known as *Tikkun Leil Shavuot*.
